Today, as we begin our celebration of Black History Month, we are delighted to welcome guest preacher The Reverend Leonard Leader. During his career in the Ontario Public Service, concurrent with an extensive lay ministry, Leonard responded to his sense of calling to Holy Orders. #### NOTES FROM FATHER GEOFF

#### CONCERNING THE PERMANENT OR VOCATIONAL DIACONATE

Information Article No. 3 of a series of 7

This is the third information article of our series on the Restoration of the Diaconate, dealing with the Pastoral Ministry of the people of God.

#### PASTORAL MINISTRY OF THE PEOPLE OF GOD

The pastoral functions of the all baptized persons are broad and varied. The following functions are primarily focused upon ministry to the Church's own people. These pastoral functions (and others) are presently being performed by individuals and groups in the parish, both ordained and lay. While the functions of the Deacon will be primarily to serve the world outside the Church, the Deacon may assist where needed in the parish in these pastoral areas.

- 1. Visiting the sick and home-bound parishioners.
- 2. Caring for and about the parish's poor.
- 3. Coordinating programs for visiting and integrating newcomers.
- 4. Parish stewardship development.
- 5. Instructing adults through education that could include the preparation for baptism and confirmation or scripture study.
- 6. Instructing parents and godparents for baptisms.
- 7. Leading small study/prayer sharing groups.
- 8. Organizing and serving groups and participating in other activities to serve special needs within the Christian community such as the relationship with St James' Town and the parish refugee effort.
- 9. Assisting with training acolytes or altar servers.
- 10. Serving parish discussion groups.
- 11. Organizing and coordinating retreats, workshops, and similar activities.
- 12. Helping those with problems, and where needed, assist in seeking helpful counseling.
- 13. Assuming responsibility for some aspect of parish or diocesan administration.
- 14. Preaching occasionally.
- 15. Reading passages from scripture for the Eucharistic service.
