

CONCERNING THE PERMANENT OR VOCATIONAL DIACONATE

THE DEACON'S LITURGICAL MINISTRY AND ITS MEANING

Deacons have specific liturgical functions that have their origins in the life of the early Church and represent a pastoral ministry. Some examples appear below. At SPSS some of our servers, other laypeople and our clergy perform some of these roles, and will continue to do so.


It must be emphasized that a deacon cannot and will not displace the many members of the parish who presently share in the liturgy. The deacon will serve where needed.
