MUSICAL NOTES

About the Postlude....

Today is Trinity Sunday, where the theological message of three in one, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, or the Trinity is key. So it is that the postlude is so suited to today. It is Bach's triple fugue, otherwise known colloquially as the 'St Anne Fugue'. This fugue has become known as the "St. Anne" in English-speaking countries because of the first subject's resemblance to a hymn tune of the same name by the English composer William Croft, a tune that was not likely known to Bach. You will know the hymn tune as "O God, our help in ages past'.

However, Bach wrote the triple fugue on this melody as a symbol of the Trinity, using the number three throughout, in subtle ways. First, the hymn tune recurs in three connected fugues, and does so each time with another personality. The first fugue is calm, glorious and majestic; in the second the theme seems to be disguised, and is only occasionally recognizable in its true shape, as if to suggest the divine assumption of an earthly form; in the third, it is almost explodes into exuberant eighth notes, as if the Pentecostal wind were arriving. So, it will not surprise you also to know that the key signature, E b, has three flats (or black notes), and the time signature is structured essentially on three beats to a bar. You will know this ¾ time signature as the foundation of a waltz, where the tactus really has one strong beat and two weak beats to the bar, again signifying Three in One. So it is that 'the St Anne' is what organists play on Trinity Sunday to underscore the liturgical season.

Another historic moment involving the St Anne occurred in St Paul's Cathedral in the 1830s. Mendelssohn was playing Bach in the afternoon for a very large afternoon audience, at the request of his friend Thomas Attwood, the cathedral organist there. The verger, not having had lunch, turned the blower to the organ off in front of the 4,000 strong right in the middle of the St Anne's third movement, while Mendelssohn was playing. The verger was late for high tea with his wife. The organ died off sounding like a sickly cow.
