## A WORD FROM THE ASSISTANT CURATE

### **Thy Kingdom Come ...** **thykingdomcome.global**

Did you know about the global wave of prayer, ‘Thy Kingdom Come’ that takes place between Ascension Day, May 30th and Pentecost Sunday, June 9th? ‘Thy Kingdom Come’ started in 2016 as an invitation from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York to Christians around the world to pray for more people to come to know Jesus. What started as a Church of England initiative has grown into an international and ecumenical call to prayer. This past year churches from over 65 different denominations in 114 countries around the world participated in ‘Thy Kingdom Come.’

The inspiration for ‘Thy Kingdom Come’ is drawn from the Acts of the Apostles, where it says:

*“You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses ...to the ends of the earth. When he had said this...he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight...Then they returned to Jerusalem ... and were constantly devoting themselves to prayer... When the day of Pentecost had come they were all together in one place... All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit... and that day about three thousand persons were added.”*

The Archbishops are inviting Christians around the world to pray with the same devotion for the purpose of renewing the call to evangelism and to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with those around us. Specifically, they asked for us to pray that five people we know might come to faith in Jesus Christ. For Anglicans, evangelism is a word that can unsettle us. We can feel embarrassed to share our faith to someone else because we do not want to seem like we are trying to sell something. We recognize the need to respect others and know the dangers caused by attempting to imposing our own ideas. Convincing others, especially when it is a question of a subject as intimate as trust in God, cannot be an argument to be won.

However, in Christ, we have something entirely life-changing to share. We evangelize in the name of Christ because above all we bear witness to the transformation of our own lives. If we can evangelize, it is because the resurrection has already begun and taken root in our own lives and transformed us. The Archbishops invitation to pray for five people, is thus, a call to renew our own personal commitment to prayer. On the thykingdomcome.global website the bishops have made available a daily prayer resource that encourages us to root our evangelism in the thrice-daily rhythm of the Daily Office, with a particular focus on Scriptures Readings and Intercessory prayers in which evangelism is the central theme. You can download their resource for free and participate with thousands of others as we pray that the Holy Spirit would inspire and equip us to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with our friends and families, our communities and networks.

## PARISH NEWS

**A Note about the Music** This morning's choral and Organ music is from opposite ends of the spectrum. The Victoria setting of the motet *Ascendens Christus in Altum* (1572) was the most famous composer in 16th-century Spain, and was one of the most important composers of the Counter-Reformation, along with Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina in Italy.

The Prelude and Postlude are the 2nd and 3rd movements from Olivier Messiaen's *Ascension Suite* (1932). The respective sub-titles are: "Serene alleluias of a soul that longs for heaven" and "Outbursts of joy from a soul before the glory of Christ, which is its own glory". The prelude includes recognizable "bird call" flourishes on a solo flute stop, a emblematic feature in Messiaen's compositions. The *Berliner Messe* (1990) mass setting is by the Estonian composer Arvo Part, first performed in St Hedvig's Cathedral on the Feast of the Ascension. The choir will sing this mass setting including the Gloria in services in Gloucester and Chichester cathedrals in August.
