# The Sacrament of Holy Baptism

*Standing at the font the Priest greets the congregation.*

*Priest* The Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God,  
and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

*All* **And also with you.**

*Priest* There is one body and one Spirit.

*All* **One hope in God's call to us.**

*Priest* One Lord, one faith, one baptism.

*All* **One God and Father of all.**

*Priest* The candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*Parents and Sponsors:*

**I present *Landon Cunningham Twight* to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.**

*Priest* Dear friends, seeing that God in his love wills all people to be saved from the broken nature which they inherit, as well as from the actual sins which they commit, and that our Saviour Christ said, "No one can enter into the kingdom of God, except they be born anew of Water and of the Holy Spirit", we now call upon God the Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, to bestow his grace upon Landon; that he may be baptized with Water and the Holy Spirit, and received into Christ's holy Church, and be made a living member of the same.

*Priest* Heavenly Father, look upon this child, wash him and sanctify him by your Holy Spirit, and make him a living member of the Body of Christ. May he be faithful and joyful in hope, and rooted in charity; may the Holy Spirit be born and grow in him, leading and inspiring him all the days of his life, until he comes to your eternal kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

A reading from the Gospel According to St Mark.

They brought young children to Jesus that he should touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. But when Jesus saw this, he was displeased and said, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.' And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

*All* **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

## Thanksgiving Over the Water

In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life. We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Grant that he who is here dedicated to you may also be endued with heavenly virtues, and everlastingly rewarded, through your mercy, O blessed Lord God, who lives and reigns, world without end. **Amen.**

**Epistle** *Galatians 5.1, 13-25*

*Reader* A reading from the Letter of Paul to the Galatians.

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another. Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.
