A Word from the Rector

One of the most important ministries at St Peter and St Simon's is the afterschool Homework Club, a program we share with Rosedale Presbyterian Church and St Andrew's united Church. From Monday to Friday, 25 children from the local community are here from three to six pm for homework supervision and recreation. If we were not offering this ministry, many if not all those children would go home to empty apartments since in most cases both parents are working, and often in more than one job to get by. The Homework Club has a modest budget that pays for supplies and the wages of one staff person. We receive a grant from the Anglican Foundation. Each partner parish contributes \$5000 to support the program. We are behind on our parish contributions. Thanks to the generosity of the parishioners who hosted the Caribbean celebration last week, one half of the proceeds are being allocated to the Homework Club, the other half to honour our commitment to Codrington College. If you would like to help support our Homework Club ministry, please donate to SPSS, and indicate that it is for his purpose. Every bit helps!

In this season we give thanks to God for the abundant blessings we enjoy, for the fruits of the earth, for food, for shelter, for the mercy and grace, all given to us by God's goodness.
