
Old Testament Lesson Acts 4.32-35

Epistle 1 John 1.1-2.2

Reader A reading from the First Letter of John.

We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life – this life was revealed, and we have seen it and testify to it, and declare to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was revealed to us – we declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete. This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us. My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin.

But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and he is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.



Hymn Notes Christ the Lord is Risen Again

Michael Weisse (c.1480-1534) was born in Silesia and became a priest and a monk at Breslau. After reading works of Martin Luther, he abandoned the monastery; went to Bohemia, and joined the Bohemian Brethren. In 1531, he became a member of their Select Council. He was also their preacher to the German communities in Bohemia and Moravia. He produced the first German hymn-book for the Brethren .which included 155 hymns written or translated by him. Weisse's hymns are characterized by a charming simplicity; and their religious tone is earnest, devout, and tender. London-born Catherine Winkworth (1829-78) is foremost in rank and popularity among translators of German hymns. Her work is always faithful and conscientious. Winkworth also devoted her efforts to educational work for the benefit of women. In 1870, she became the secretary of the Association for the Promotion of Higher Education for Women. She died of heart disease while in Savoy.

Wurttemburg was first used for the hymn Straf' mich nicht in deinem Zorn. One story says that the tune was composed by Joseph Rosenmuller, the music director of Leipzig. Supposedly, he composed this tune in 1655 as part of a petition asking the Elector of Dresden to restore him to his position.

The Bohemian (or Moravian) Brethren, founded in 1457 by followers of Jan Hus, is one of the oldest Protestant denominations. Personal conversion to Christ is the foundation of the faith, and Scripture is the only rule. The denomination was renewed in 1722 by Count Zinzendorf, a friend of John and Charles Wesley.
