A Reading from the Book of Genesis.

Jacob left Beer-sheba and went towards Haran. He came to a certain place and stayed there for the night, because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones of the place, he put it under his head and lay down in that place. And he dreamed that there was a ladder set up on the earth, the top of it reaching to heaven; the angels of God were ascending and descending on it. Rejoice then, you heavens and those who dwell in them! But woe to the earth and the sea, for the devil has come down to you with great wrath, because he knows that his time is short!'



Holy Communion

- Holy Communion is administered at the High Altar and a standing station at the St. Peter
 Altar in the south aisle. If you do not wish to receive communion. You may come
 forward for a blessing. Fold your hands over your chest to indicate this to the
 administering priest. Please follow the directions of the sides-people.
- You may choose to receive the bread only where the fullness of the sacrament is present.
 If you do not wish to drink from the common cup, simply receive the bread and return to
 your seat. You may also touch the base of the chalice while the words of administration
 are said.
- Intinction (dipping the bread into the chalice of wine) is not permitted in the Anglican Diocese of Toronto.

Hymn Note for Ye Holy Angels Bright (CP # 323)

Richard Baxter (1615-91) studied theology privately and was ordained an Anglican priest. A supporter of Cromwell, Baxter served as a chaplain in the Parliamentary Army. Baxter later served as the chaplain to King Charles II. However in 1662, he turned to nonconformity and spent two years in prison before being pardoned. Richard Baxter was considered too puritan for bishops and too episcopalian for Presbyterians. This hymn began as a 16-stanza poem appended to Baxter's *Poor Man's Family Book* (1672). Baxter entreated landlords and rich men to give this book to their tenants and poor neighbours. Baxter's poem was drastically revised in 1838 by John Hampden Gurney (1802-62), rector of St. Mary's, Marylebone (1847-62). The verses contained in modern hymn books are by Gurney.
