From the Rector A Note About the Sanctuary Paintings

Today at Evensong we are rededicating the restored paintings in the sanctuary.

Sometime in the early 1970's the walls were whitewashed and the paintings covered, for reasons that continue to be a mystery. The restoration project began over twenty-years ago when the artwork on the south sanctuary wall was uncovered and restored by artist Andrew Kwichinski. In the spring of 2024 the work was finally completed by his son Maurice who apprenticed under his father at St Simon's those many years ago. Parishioner Russel Smith has made this possible with a generous donation in loving memory of the late Carl Lee Shain who had a passion for art and hoped to have the paintings in our parish restored.

The artwork dates to 1914 when the parish was growing and the church building enhanced and beautified. Arts and Crafts style decoration, classic of the time, was adopted to compliment the architecture.

The paintings are heavily influenced by the work of English artist and book illustrator Walter Crane (15 August 1845 – 14 March 1915). Considered to be the most influential, and among the most prolific, children's book creators of his generation, Crane's work featured some of the more colourful and detailed beginnings of the child-in-the-garden motifs that would characterize many nursery rhymes and children's stories for decades to come. He was part of the Arts and Crafts movement that produced an array of paintings, illustrations, children's books, ceramic tiles, wallpapers and other decorative arts in the style of William Morris with whom Crane may have had an association in the early twentieth century. The decorative work in the Church was possibly executed by P.C Browne and Co., a firm renowned at the time for their decorative work in Canada.

The image over the altar is of two angels kneeling in worship and adoration. On the east wall (south side), a chalice with grapes was uncovered. Unfortunately, the painting under the angel on the east wall (northside) was damaged badly. We chose to compliment the image of the chalice and grapes with a wheat sheave on a gold plate. A frieze on the north and south sanctuary walls is decorated with escutcheons depicting the four Evangelists, the Prophet Daniel and the Paschal Lamb. You will also notice the Latin inscription at the altar, *Jesus+ Hominum+ Salvator* (Jesus Saviour of Mankind) has been adorned with gold leaf.

The restoration of this art is a tremendous gift to the parish. While restoring our historic Church, the visual beauty of the paintings ties the whole Chancel and Sanctuary together. It is an outward and visible sign that we are a community of worship and prayer. We join our voices with angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven to sing God's praise and glory, worshipping the Holy One in spirit, in truth, and in the beauty of holiness.

From The Wardens; Stewardship Update

Congregational givings for the month of August total \$19,761. Congregational givings year to date to the end of August total \$188,324, compared to a year to date budgeted amount of \$190,301. Our overall deficit (ie., including expenses) to the end of August is \$32,705, compared to a full year budgeted deficit of \$18,506. Our overall cash position is and will remain tight for the foreseeable future.

As you can see, work continues on replacing the flat portion of our roof and this is expected to be completed quite soon. Please consider thoughtfully your part in helping us to achieve our budget target for 2024 and thus allow our various ministries to thrive.
