A Word from the Rector: *The Season of Stewardship*

In his letter to the Church at Ephesus, Paul the Apostle encourages the faithful to be “filled with the Spirit, with psalms, hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord, giving thanks always for all things to God and the Father in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ”.

The autumn season is a time of thanksgiving, when we, perhaps more intentionally than at other times, express our gratitude for all God gives to us. We are thankful for so much: for the beauty of creation, the harvest and the abundance of food we enjoy; for our family and friends; and for all the blessings of life. We give thanks for our Parish Church and the rich life we enjoy in this dynamic community of faith. Here at SPSS this is also our *Season of Stewardship*. One important way we express gratitude is through generosity - radical generosity of spirit, time, and resources. There are many needs and opportunities before us. As well as supporting and growing our ministry, our historic building requires constant upkeep. We just replaced the roof over the narthex at a cost of over three hundred thousand dollars. This was made possible by obtaining a loan from the diocese. Bequests are forthcoming, but we continue to carry a deficit. The roof over the Church and Parish Hall also need replacement very soon.

Costs rise in the Church as much as everywhere else. We are asking each member of our parish to consider carefully and prayerfully our financial commitment for the remainder of the year and into 2025. Today we welcome Peter Misiaszek who is speaking to us about Legacy Giving. Please join us after the service for a light lunch and conversation. As you make your ongoing commitment now, please also consider the Church in your estate planning. We are very blessed here at SPSS. A question each of us must ask is how should you and I respond to ensure that this parish continues to be a strong, faithful presence in the heart of Toronto? In thinking of these things, remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he said, “*it is more blessed to give than to receive*” (Acts. 20.35).
