Reader The first lesson is written in the fifth chapter of the Book of the Prophet Amos, beginning at the fourth verse.

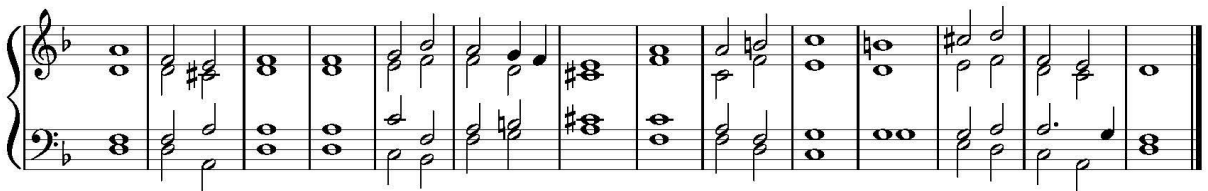

Hymn Notes: *O God Our Help in Ages Past* CP # 528)

Isaac Watts (1674-1748) is known as the creator of the modern English hymn and the father of English hymnody. He was opposed to the medieval office hymns and the Reformation paraphrases. Born in Southampton, Watts attended the Abbey Bay Congregational Church. Many of his hymns were written early in his life for this congregation. In 1699, Watts became the minister for the Independent Congregation in Mark Lane, London, and served there until he retired because of ill health in 1712. He devoted himself to writing hymns and theological and philosophical works. In all, he wrote more than 600 hymns. This hymn, a paraphrase of Psalm 90:1-5, was published in his *Psalms of David* (1719). This hymn is mentioned in Charlotte Bronte’s novel *Shirley*.

St. Anne is attributed to William Croft (1678-1727). It is found in a volume prepared by Croft and published in 1708. Croft was organist of the Chapel Royal and Westminster Abbey and composer to the Chapel Royal. Croft’s psalm tunes are the earliest examples of those distinct from the Geneva variety. *St. Anne* is named for St. Anne’s Church, Soho, where Croft was organist (1700-11).
