## Hymn Note: O Come. O Come Emmanuel (CP # 89)

This hymn is based upon the seven Great Antiphons or "Great O's" said on successive days before and after the Magnificat at Vespers between December 17 and December 23. Each salutes the coming of the Messiah using one of the titles ascribed to him in the Scriptures. The first is "O Wisdom" and the last is "O Emmanuel." The medieval English church began the Antiphons on December 16 and added another at the end—"O Virgo virginum." Of non-Roman origin, the Antiphons were added to the Roman liturgy before the 9<sup>th</sup> century, though a quotation from Boethius (d. 525) suggests they were known as early as the 6<sup>th</sup> century. In medieval monasteries, it was common for each of the principal officers of the house to sing his antiphon in turn. He would "keep his O" and then provide a feast for the monks. John Mason Neale (1818-66) translated and arranged the Antiphons for his *Medieval Hymns and Sequences* (1851). The earliest written version of the tune *Veni Emmanuel* is found in a 15<sup>th</sup> century *Processionale* housed In the Biblioteque Nationale in Paris. The book originally belonged to a house of French Franciscan nuns.
