Hymn Note for Ye Holy Angels Bright (CP # 323)

Dr. Johnson advised Boswell to read all Richard Baxter's books – some 25 volumes on various subjects. Baxter (1615-91), born in Shropshire, studied theology privately and was ordained an Anglican priest in 1640. A supporter of Cromwell, Baxter served as a chaplain in the Parliamentary Army. After the Restoration, he served as chaplain to King Charles II. However in 1662, he turned to nonconformity and spent two years in prison before being pardoned. Richard Baxter was considered too puritan for bishops and too episcopalian for Presbyterians. This hymn is the first 5 stanzas of a 16-stanza poem appended to Baxter's *Poor Man's Family Book* (1672). This poem links together praise to God from humanity and from the universe. Baxter's poem was drastically revised in 1838 by John Hampden Gurney (1802-62), rector of St. Mary's, Marylebone (1847-62). The verses contained in modern hymn books are by Gurney.

DARWALL was written by John Darwall (1731-89) for Psalm 148 in Williams' *New Universal Psalmodist* (1770). Born in Staffordshire, Darwall graduated from Oxford (1756) and spent his entire career at St. Matthew's Church, Walsall. He wrote tunes for the entire psalter. He also wrote a pamphlet of verse on the American Revolution which he dedicated to Lord North.
