Hymn Note for Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus (CP # 461)

DudleyTyng succeeded his father as rector of the Church of thr Epiphany, Philadelphia, in 1854. In 1856, he was forced out because of his anti-slavery sermons. He founded a new congregation to bring husbands and fathers to Christ. In March 1858, he spoke to a crowd of 5000 men. Two weeks later, he died as the result of a farm machinery accident. His last words were, "Tell them to stand up for Jesus." George Duffield. Jr., the pastor of Temple Presbyterian Church, Philadelphia, was so impressed by Tyng that he preached a sermon on Ephesians 6:14 soon after the funeral and ended it with his new hymn in honour of Tyng. Duffield (1818-88) was educated at Yale and Union Theological Seminary before being

ordained in 1840. He served in several parishes and was regent of the University of Michigan for 7 years.

George James Webb (1803-87) was born in Wiltshire. He emigrated to Boston in 1830.

There he became organist at Old South Church and assistant to hymn tune composer Lowell Mason. They founded the Boston Academy of Music (1833). Webb became president o the Handel and Haydn Society in 1840. Webb composed MORNING LIGHT on his voyage to Boston. Submitted by Diane Way
