## Reading Augustine's Confessions in Epiphany

When Saint Augustine wrote his *Confessions* he was facing and responding to a growing spread of asceticism in the Roman world. His task was twofold: to explain to himself the significance of his conversion to Christianity, and to do so in terms that would convince his readers that this was indeed the one, true faith. In his attempt to achieve these aims, Augustine produced a masterpiece of intellectual biography with an emotional intensity that makes his *Confessions* one of the great works of Christian spiritual writing.

In January we will be studying the *Confessions*. We will meet to discuss its content and look forward to two lectures by Father Walter Hannam who teaches at St Augustine's Seminary in Toronto. Father Walter is the Rector of St Bartholomew's Anglican Church on Dundas Street in Regent Park.

### Hymn Notes: *Hark! The Glad Sound (CP # 98)*

This Advent hymn, based on Luke 4:18-19, was written in 1738 by Philip Doddridge (1702-51). The son of a London merchant, he was influenced by the Presbyterian divine Samuel Clark. Though the Duchess of Bedford offered to support him at Cambridge, Doddridge chose to enter the non-conforming academy at Kibworth (1719). In 1729, he became pastor of the independent congregation at Northampton and was asked to conduct the non-conforming academy at Market Harborough. An indefatigable worker, his health failed; and he was sent by the congregation to Lisbon to recover (1751). He died there soon after. Doddridge was a good friend of Isaac Watts. His nearly 400 hymns were published in 1755. His *Rise and Progress of Religion in the Soul* (1745) was the most important Puritan devotional classic of the 18<sup>th</sup> century. It influenced such notable men as Wilberforce and Simcoe.

RIHMOND was composed by Thomas Haweis (1734-1820) and published in his *Carmina Christo (1792)*. He attended Oxford and was ordained in 1757. In 1764, he became rector of Aldwinkle, Northamptonahire. From 1768, he was chaplain to the Countess of Huntingdon and manager of the college she established in Wales. Haweis was a friend of John Newton. The tune was adapted by Samuel Webbe and published in his *Psalmody* (1853). There the tune was named Richmond in honour of Webbe's friend Leigh Richmond, rector of Turvey.
