Reading Augustine's *Confessions* in Epiphany

When Saint Augustine wrote his *Confessions* he was facing and responding to a growing spread of asceticism in the Roman world. His task was twofold: to explain to himself the

significance of his conversion to Christianity, and to do so in terms that would convince his readers that this was indeed the one, true faith. In his attempt to achieve these aims, Augustine produced a masterpiece of intellectual biography with an emotional intensity that makes his *Confessions* one of the great works of Christian spiritual writing.

In January we will be studying the *Confessions*. We will meet to discuss its content and look forward to two lectures by Father Walter Hannam who teaches at St Augustine's Seminary in Toronto. Father Walter is the Rector of St Bartholomew's Anglican Church on Dundas Street in Regent Park.

Hymn Notes: *Worship the Lord in the Beauty of Holiness* (CP # 385)

John Samuel Bewley Monsell (1811-75) was born in Derry and educated at Trinity College, Dublin. He was ordained in 1834 and served as chaplain to the Bishop of Connor. He then moved to England and served at Egham in Surrey (1853-70) and then as rector of St. Nicholas, Guildford. He was killed when he fell off the church roof during repairs. Monsell believed that hymns should be fervent and joyous. He wrote about 300 hymns and published 11 books of poetry. This hymn, published in 1863, emphasizes the gifts we are to lay before God. It is thought of as an Epiphany hymn but is used throughout the church year. The first line is from Psalm 29:2.

UTTINGEN was first published in Reinhardt's *Choral Buch* (Uttingen, 1759) to accompany the German hymn "Was lebet." The tune was first used to accompany Monsell's poem in *The English Hymnal* (1906).
